## ACADEMICS & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES DURING THE PANDEMIC

**2020** has been a year which has brought about unprecedented and transformational changes in the way we teach and learn. The response to the Coronavirus has demonstrated how technology has brought about a shift from a teaching culture to a learning culture.

Ms. Aditi Misra, Director Principal, Delhi Public School, Sector 45, Gurgaon, is a visionary and a leader par excellence, who embraces change and fearlessly treads the uncharted path for the benefit of the school community. With the call for the lockdown on 19th March, 2020, the school under her able guidance was equipped to transact online classes. The Principal adopted the strategy of immersion process where the teachers were given support and technical guidance to conduct virtual classes. Ms. Misra's weekly inspirational videos motivated the students and teachers alike to face the challenges with gusto.

Over the course of the past few months, students have been empowered to learn in flexible and collaborative ways.

- **Flipped classroom** has been adopted to create a dynamic and interactive classroom environment. The virtual classroom has provided an ideal platform for adopting flipped classroom approach resulting in better student engagement
- **Google Jam board** has been used as an effective collaboration tool in the classroom. It has allowed students to engage in learning through real time collaboration
- **Game based student response systems** like Kahoot and Quizzes have greatly enriched the quality of student learning in the classroom through better student engagement, motivation and improved learning experience
- The school has conducted both objective and subjective online assessments for students to provide them valuable insights about their academic progress
- Art Integrated Projects and Art Integrated Learning, introduced by the Central Board of Secondary Education has enabled students use multiple skills and abilities. It has helped in making the teaching and learning process more joyful through integration of Indian art and culture.

As **co-scholastic activities** are an integral part of the holistic development of learners, the school calendar was reimaged. The school hosted Online Inter School Competitions like the Cultural Fest-Goonj, Science Fest- Capax, Computer Fest- Alpha Node and Commerce Fest E-Comm Parv. These festivals offered a plethora of activities which developed the acumen for problem-solving, reasoning, critical and creative thinking, communication and collaboration among the young learners.

The participants exhibited enthusiasm, and camaraderie on the virtual platform. **Creative and innovative ideas** were shared and experimented by the participants. The Cultural Fest- Goonj went international as it witnessed students from France, Germany and Poland participating in the same.

The school partook in various **Inter School Events** organized by other institutions and International Organisations. The student leaders engaged in dialogues at various webinars and voiced their opinion as change makers of the 21st century.

In-house, **online co-scholastic activities** were held all across the school to nurture skill sets and also help in the social and emotional development of the students through experiential learning.

The Club and House activities, Guest Speaker Programmes, Classroom Assemblies, Career Counselling and Peer Education provided the impetus to learn beyond the class. The students engaged in community service by creating motivating videos and podcasts to spread positivity in the wake of pandemic among the students of Shiksha Kendra, an afternoon school for marginalized sections of the society.

**Ideated by Ms. Misra, seven editions of the Wellness Webinar Series became the new normal**. The webinar series on varied topics related to the school community were a unique platform for discussion and exchange of ideas among the stakeholders. The online co-scholastic calendar for the coming months is bustling with events and activities which are interspersed and interwoven with academics, for the best blend of teaching and learning.




