The event started with the school's student comperes welcoming Patil, who has also been honoured with the Ustad Bismillah Khan award by the Sangeet Natak Akademi.

In her address, Patil thanked the audience for showing interest in Indian classical music. A pre-recorded video of her presentation enthralled the audience.

The interaction between her and the young learners was instructive, informative and delightful.

In addition, she also shared the nuances of different raagas and taals of Hindustani classical singing.

A raga or raag is a melodic framework for improvisation akin to a melodic mode in Indian classical music. Taal is the term used in Indian classical music to refer to musical meter.

The event culminated with the students proposing the vote of thanks on behalf of their school and the Spic Macay.
