## MR VACCINATION- WORKSHOP REPORT

The morning of 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2018 witnessed eminent dignitaries and principals from various schools coming in unison to be a part of a Measles Rubella Vaccination Drive organized at DPS Gurgaon which will be the nodal centre for the campaign. This workshop was conducted and attended by an exceptional team of doctors from prestigious hospitals to spread awareness about Measles and Congenital Rubella Syndrome and how these infections can be fatal for the children of our nation.

The Principal, Ms. Aditi Misra welcomed Mr. R. K Singh, the Additional Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon who had joined the workshop to spearhead the awareness campaign in the district. Ms. Misra in her welcome address expressed her gratitude for all who had come forward for this campaign and shared her belief that if this responsibility is shouldered by all, these fatal infections will surely be eradicated from our country and we will be able to provide a better and brighter future to our children.

Mr. R. K Singh also addressed the gathering and motivated all the educators to start a drive in their respective schools to sensitize and educate parents about the vaccinations and how these infections can be cureless in some cases.

This campaign witnessed other eminent guests like Dr. B.K. He entrusted the principals and dignitaries from various schools to urge people to help the government in the eradication of these infections.
