To celebrate the joy of reading books, Book Week was celebrated at Delhi Public School, Gurgaon on a virtual platform.

Book Week in the Senior Wing was conducted from 2nd to 7th November 2020. Students of class IX made meaningful posters on 'Fit India – Safe India' and conveyed the message of how to remain positive and healthy during the pandemic, through their beautifully designed posters.

DEAR programme was conducted for classes IX to XII (Drop Everything And Read). During this week, children read books with their family members, they clicked pictures and shared them with



teachers.

Book Week was held for the Middle School students from 14th to 18th December, the theme being 'endangered animals'. Students of Class VII made pen holders and decorated them. They also displayed information on any one endangered species (land/water), mentioning what they could do to help protect them.

Class VIII students designed a diorama which is a miniature model that shows a situation such as a historical event or animals in their natural environment - land or water, in a way that looks real. As one of the reasons for animals becoming endangered is destruction of their habitat, students built a diorama of an animal in its natural habitat.

DEAR Programme was conducted on 15th December for teachers and students of the Middle School, wherein the readers dropped everything and read for 10 minutes in their third slot.





Junior School celebrated the Book Week from 24th to 26th November 2020, to inculcate the love for reading among students.

A virtual story-telling session was organized for class III, conducted by Ms. Renu Chamarty, on 21st November 2020. The session was interesting, and students enjoyed the story narrated by her as she discussed the importance of books and reading.

Class IV students made beautiful book marks and wrote a quote on 'reading'.
